Bubble Snakes

Find a clean, empty plastic bottle. Using a pair of scissors (and adult supervision), carefully cut the bottom off of the plastic bottle. Cover the freshly-cut hole with a piece of fabric that is similar to a washcloth or cotton sock. Use a rubber band to keep the fabric in place. Dip the fabric-covered end of the bottle into the bowl of bubble solution. Blow into the mouth of the plastic bottle and, before you know it, you'll be creating Bubble Snakes like a pro!



Bubble Window

Make your own Bubble Window using string and 2 straws: Cut a piece of string about 3 feet long. Thread two straws onto the string and tie the ends of the string together to make a loop. Pull the straws to each side so you create a rectangle. Dip your bubble blower into the bubble solution. Pull it out slowly. When you notice a thin sheet of soap film between your straws, blow slowly and create a large bubble!



Bubble Fluid

A good bubble fluid recipe is one part Johnson's Baby Shampoo dish washing soap and ten parts water. It makes good bubbles and it won't hurt when it gets in kid's eyes.
